Send IT was established to host extreme long-range (ELR) competitions and promote sports-shooting in the Western Cape. As a group, we want to

host events free of agendas, meetings, politics, and cumbersome processes. To date, this has been achieved and has contributed to the success of the Send IT platform and our ability to implement new concepts quickly. The Send IT ULTRA event in 2022 is our most ambitious endeavour to date.

In 2017, we contacted Eduardo Abril de Fontcuberta, at that stage the primary contact person for the King of 2 Miles and founding member of the most prominent ELR franchise in the world. Our initial interest was to take part in the 2018 match in the USA. The conversation quickly turned to Eduardo visiting South Africa to present an ELR seminar to local shooters to assist in tackling this challenging sport. We hosted Eduardo in 2018, and his insights and expertise played a key role in what set us on course to establish Send IT, ELR Shooting.

Eduardo is an unbelievably talented individual who is happy to share his knowledge and life experience with

fellow shooters. He is a renowned firearm author and weapons expert, a 50 BMG World Champion, Master Sniper Instructor and, to top it off, has been awarded a 1st dan black belt, among his many other achievements!

Send IT was grappling with the idea of hosting a match accessible on a national level. The biggest obstacle is the size of the country, in that match participants from up country need to travel more than 1 000 km to participate in a Send IT match in Cape

At Khoisan Karoo Conservancy we were introduced to owner PC Ferreira. PC is an entrepreneurial individual who loves

hosting large groups of people for events at his guest lodge. His property in Hanover, Northern Cape is in the middle of South Africa, ensuring that Cape Town and Johannesburg based shooters need to travel roughly the same distance to the venue.

PC quickly bought into the concept of hosting a Send IT ELR match on his farm, and swiftly arranged a quantity surveyor to verify distances and a building contractor to construct shooting platforms for the comfort of match participants.

The Send IT ULTRA event was targeted as our flagship match for 2022. The idea was floated to get Eduardo back

to South Africa, as there has been enormous progress in ELR shooting over the past couple of years. This was the ideal opportunity to catch up on current learnings and trends in the world of competitive ELR shooting. Eduardo happily accepted the invitation. It is a great privilege to host an individual of his calibre.

With the ideal venue secured in Hanover, we decided on a two-day match format to test shooters to the maximum and get the most out of the range over a given period. All the elements were lined up for the Send IT ULTRA event, consisting of a two-day ELR seminar and two-day ELR match!

Eduardo kicked off the seminar by touching on basic, yet very important, fundamentals that all shooters should master and continue to implement to be successful. It is easy to learn bad habits, and it was good to be reminded how important these elements are in shooting.

The ELR seminar had a particular focus on preparing shooters to achieve first round hits. Experienced shooters know the benefit of having a couple of shots to achieve a hit – it is that first- or second-round hit that really matters. Interestingly, that line of thinking is similar to what was implemented for the Send IT scoring system.

Topics covered included advanced ballistics, data gathering and its importance, and how to interpret the data readings taken with specialised equipment. The process aims to remove unknowns from the data used to calculate a firing solution. It sounds simple, but we are quick to make adjustments in our ballistic solvers. However, exactly which values to adjust is critically important. You could end up solving one error with another error. This will only hold true for a given distance. Hence the predictability of the solver will again be compromised at an alternative distance.

In addition, the concept of an error budget was thoughtfully explained – how much of an error budget is possible in your predictions or with your current rifle system? I am sure Eduardo's favourite ELR calibre (the 460 Steyr, launching a 560 gr projectile at 3 250 fps) will give the shooter a considerable leeway.

It got very interesting when the discussion turned to wind reading, or 'Wind Wars', as Eduardo referred to it. Eduardo has decades of experience behind rifles and interpreting various atmospheric conditions over his career. The concept of present, past, and future wind was discussed, as well as the speed at which wind travels from the shooter to the target – a fascinating discussion that could explain many a missed shot.

At the ULTRA we witnessed this theory in action when the wind flags picked up and shooters overcorrected for conditions that were not present where the bullet travelled. It is a concept you need to think about and experience to grasp fully.

Eduardo designed a tall target test that can be done at 25 m to measure a scope's tracking error, if any. It is easy to assume your rifle's optics are tracking perfectly. But have you tested it? All seminar participants were afforded the opportunity to test their scope's tracking. The results remain strictly confidential to not favour any brand. However, to be 100% confident in your optic's ability to track true, it needs to be tested to be verified.

Lastly, Eduardo touched on the growth of .22LR ELR shooting and its role as an ELR training platform. Eduardo is infatuated with this little rimfire cartridge and explained just how excellent a platform it is to train and learn about ELR shooting. At Send IT we fully agree with him!

firearm discussions. Eduardo had everyone listening and thinking about every concept he explained in great detail based on personal experience. Fellow shooter John Justus described his seminar experience:

"What an honour to be able to listen to and take in years of experience of tactical and long-range shooting from a world class champion. The way he kept a group of over 40 men and women engaged and focused for two days speaks highly to his level of knowledge and real-world experience: The understanding needed to trust and ensure the accuracy of the data that impacts elevation; to read the factors influencing wind drift and applying that to our ability to Send IT accurately down range.

Eduardo, you're a legend. Thank you!"

The range was designed and set up for four elevated shooting positions, with four unique ranges of three targets each. On each range a match participant engaged Target 1 and 2 twice and Target 3 with three shots, for a total of seven shots per range, before handing over to his or her shooting partner and spotter to complete the course of fire with another seven shots at the same targets – all within the allotted time limit of 15 minutes per team.

We elected a low round count per target to reduce a shooter's ability to 'walk' shots towards the targets. Completing all four ranges resulted in each competitor firing 28 shots per day for a total count of 56 rounds for the two-day match.

The scoring system was developed to reward shooters with higher points should they hit further targets. Points were allocated based on the range of the target in metres times a higher factor for a first-round hit versus a second- or third-round hit (where applicable). Scores achieved on Day 1 and 2 were combined to determine the overall individual and team standings after the match.

Teams were allocated into four self-governing groups that rotated between the different ranges throughout the day. Each group had a dedicated range officer. Participants familiar with the Send IT format were able to assist newcomers understand the match proceedings. In such an environment, competitors are exposed to broadly similar atmospheric conditions, and are not subjected to the vagaries of an allocated time and weather slot in any day.

The distances were set to be within the range of medium sized calibres to accommodate prospective ELR shooters. All targets were fitted with two MagnetoSpeed hit indicators to eliminate the risk of equipment failure and provide visual identification of hits. Targets were 2 MOA in size (width and height) at a given distance, set 900 m to 2 200 m and professionally surveyed to pinpoint the exact distances. At Send IT, rifles up to .50 calibre weighing 18.14 kg (40 pounds) or less (in ready-to-fire configuration) are welcome, according to the rules.

The 2-Mile Challenge

Having hosted a seminar in 2018, we learnt that grown men cannot sit still for two full days. We had to add some spice, so why not a 2-mile challenge? The rules were simple: Ten minutes and seven shots at the 2-mile target, with a fabulous prize up for the shooter with the most confirmed hits!

Twenty shooters took on the challenge. They had to contend with a firm 14 mph to 20 mph wind varying from 9 'o clock to half past ten. The target was set at 3 272 m, fitted with MagnetoSpeed hit indicators and

viewed from two camera systems to record any potential impact.

At least seven shooters missed the target by a whisker, only to hear the groans from the spotters at how close that shot was to hitting the almighty

2-mile target. However, it was Etienne de Beer who managed to record a successful impact with his third shot at the target. Etienne used a Sako 338 LM with the very popular 300 gr Berger OTM Tactical bullet. Well done, Etienne!

Match results and standout performances

Friday and Saturday's proceedings kicked off promptly at 7:30 am with a competitor meeting to discuss the rules and procedures for the day. First shots were fired at 8:00 am. On both days, the 40 competitors completed the course of fire by 15:00. This gave ample time to enjoy a couple of cold beverages after the match, while viewing the spectacular Karoo sunset.

The four shooting platforms were built high up on a hill overlooking the shooting range, with targets speckled across the landscape. Each range was colour coded and appropriately numbered to assist shooters to identify the correct target. It is not uncommon

for shooters to report considerably more windage adjustments required to hit the target than what is initially measured at the shooting platform. Simply put, as the shooting position is elevated, the bullet travels through air less subject to drag than at ground level, resulting in stronger winds.

Day 1 greeted shooters with hectic winds of up to a maximum speed of 53 mph. Making it even more difficult was the highly unpredictable wind direction, with angles changing swiftly on short notice. It was a tough day for shooting, but still it produced amazing scores.

Tallying up the scores

for Day 1 saw Danie du Preez on top, followed by Etienne de Beer, who managed to hit three out of three on both the 2 000 m and 2 201 m targets! Etienne certainly had the long shots dialled in for the weekend. Danie made impact with 19 out of his 28 shots, while Etienne achieved 15 hits, highlighting the importance of scoring on the far targets.

The ever-present Pieter Eksteen placed 3rd (17 hits), followed by Michael Hitchcock, who also got 17 hits.

Positions 4 to 7 were separated by a single scoring shot, with Schalk Jacobs, DJ van Zyl, Jon Hamlet and Herman Maree all still in the hunt. A shooter to highlight was 17th placed James Prevser, using a very modest 7 RSAUM chambered rifle. Well done, James!

At the end of Day 1, Team AVO (Danie du Preez and DJ van Zyl) were in the lead, but would they be able to keep the wolves at bay? Great shooting from Danie and DJ set them up with a healthy lead over Team Boetas (Charl Gous and Michael Hitchcock) and the Weekend Warriors (Bernard and Pieter Eksteen). The teams from 3% Tactical (Bernard Kotze and Ivan Fourie) and APW (John Justus and Schalk Jacobs) were not far behind.

Day 2 presented shooters with polar opposite wind conditions. What was initially viewed as a favourable day for shooting quickly stunned match participants due to baffling missed shots. The wind was a faint 5 mph to 10 mph, but it was extremely difficult to forecast the direction. It was so inconsistent that the wind flags and mirage gave shooters conflicting readings, making it very difficult to estimate the wind direction.

Shooters had to constantly battle a wind that changed direction from 5 'o clock to 7 'o clock - just enough to push them off the target. At times the mirage would go into a boil and shift direction aggressively while a shooter tried to complete his or her string of fire.



Evaluating the scores

for Day 2 lead us to conclude that match participants produced better scores. Out of 28 potential scoring shots, Pieter Eksteen and Ivan Fourie had 21 hits, DJ van Zyl and Pine Louw 20, and Bernard Eksteen and Danie du Preez 18.

However, there was one shooter who stood out from the crowd on Day 2. Dwayne Cronje, having not received his ELR rifle licence in time, rocked up with a 6.5 Creedmoor and manged to achieve the 9th best score on Day 2 with 16 out of 28 hits. Unbelievable shooting! Thank you for being a sport and taking on the challenge even though you were outgunned.

This achievement will get some of the Creedmoor shooters across the country fired up! I am worried about the day Dwayne's 'big' gun finally arrives! In addition, Pine Louw and Ivan Fourie produced excellent shooting on Day 2 to move up the scoring ranks. Pine placed 2nd for Day 2 and Ivan 3rd.

The only female competitor, Louise Classen, shooting for Helber MTT, had to endure a tough couple of days behind the rifle due to a ballistic solver error. Thankfully she has a great attitude and a bubbly personality. We are sure she will be back next time to give the boys a hiding with her stunning 8 Buzz custom rifle!

The final scores were calculated and ranked to determine the standings after two days of shooting. The anticipation was high. Would Danie hold on to his lead? Eduardo Abril de Fontcuberta has gained international recognition as a tactical and sniper manual writer and as one of the world's leading experts on sniping and long-range shooting. Through his work as a sniper instructor for various NATO and allied countries. his successes in international longrange competitions, and his articles and books in the US, he has reached a position among the foremost authorities on sniping, precision weapons, and extreme long-range shooting. 

When all was tallied up, we calculated that, on average, match participants received well more than their entry fees in goods and lucky draws.
